York Cup and Kim Small Shield 2021 Rules:

- The competitions will initially be run as a round robins in each Division of the York Cup and the Kim Small Shield. Refer the structure charts for each Division to understand how each competition runs.
- Points for each match shall be awarded as follows: 4 points for a win or forfeit, 2 points for a draw and 1 point for a loss. Bonus Points per match as follows. Winning team 1 BP for scoring 3 or more goals. Drawing teams 1 BP for scoring 2 or more goals. Losing team 1 BP for scoring 1 or more goals.
- 3. Teams shall be ranked based on the most points at the conclusion of the round robin matches. In the event that 2 or more teams are equal on points then the higher placed team shall be the team with the higher goal difference. Goal difference is the difference between total goals scored by a team and total goals conceded by a team over the current round robin matches. Should teams still be equal, the team having scored the most goals in the round current robin matches shall be declared as the higher placed team. Should teams still be equal the result of their matches against each other in the round robin shall be used to decide the higher placed team.
- 4. Should teams still be equal, the teams shall be separated by a toss of a coin in the Convenor's office with both managers present.
- 5. Teams in York Cup A Division will start in a single pool YA, with 9 teams and play a round robin within the pool. At the conclusion of the round robin, extra matches will be played based on your team's position in pool YA. The points and the goals will be added to your round robin scores to determine your final placing. Matches will be as follows: 1st v 2nd, 3rd v 4th, 5th v 6th and 7th v 8th. Note 9th position misses an extra match. The extra matches may only change the order of your match pairing ie 3rd place can't jump into 2nd or 1st.
- 6. Teams in York Cup B Division will start in 4 pools, YB1, YB2, YB3 and YB4 (each with 4 teams) and will play round robins within their pool. The top 2 teams from each pool will then form 2 four team pools (YBA and YBB) and play another round robin. The top 2 teams from YBA and YBB will then form another four team pool YBA1 and play another round robin. Individual match results from YBA and YBB will carry through to YBA1. Pool YBA1 determines placings 1 to 4 in York Cup B Division. A similar arrangement exists to determine the other placings in York Cup B Division. Refer to the Structure Diagram to understand progression through the round robin pools.
- 7. Teams in Kim Small Shield A Division will start in a single pool KSA, with 8 teams and play a round robin within the pool. At the conclusion of the round robin, extra matches will be played based on your team's position in pool KSA. The points and the goals will be added to your round robin scores to determine your final placing. Matches will be as follows: 1st v 2nd, 3rd v 4th, 5th v 6th and 7th v 8th. The extra matches may only change the order of your match pairing ie 3rd place can't jump into 2nd or 1st.
- 8. Teams in Kim Small Shield B Division will start in 2 pools, KSB1 and KSB2, each with 5 teams and play round robins within their pool. The top 2 teams from each pool and the highest ranked third placed team will then form a four team pool (KSBA) and play another round robin. The remaining teams and the bottom ranked 3rd placed teams from KSB1 and KSB2 will then form a four team pool (KSBB) and play another round robin. Points from KSB1 and KSB2 do not carry through to KSBA and KSBB. Positions 1-5 in Kim Small Shield B Division will be ranked from KSBA and positions 6-10 from KSBB.
- For minor placings. Teams finished on equal points shall share the minor placing.
- 10. Games shall be 25 minutes one way with no half time and no break between games. Games shall start at the appointed time. Penalty corners are not played out at the end of the appointed time. All players shall be registered with Hockey NSW or Hockey ACT and thereby have Player Insurance covered through the scheme.
- 11. Teams need to be ready to commence their match at the conclusion of the preceding match.
- 12. The Management team for the York Cup and Kim Small Shield reserve the right to remove points from teams for matches where the conduct of the coach, manager or supporters is deemed not to be consistent with the ideals and spirit of the carnivals. The management team would also hope to never have to use this rule.
