	The Men's Standing Committee has the authority to administer and manage all domestic and representative hockey for men players using powers delegated to it as a Standing Committee of the Tamworth Hockey Association Incorporated.	Constitution Clause 20-1) & 22-8)a
	This Policy document rescinds all previous administrative regulations of the Men's Standing Committee.	
	Competitions are to be conducted in accordance with provisions set down in the Tamworth Hockey Association Constitution, Competition Bylaws and these annual Policies.	Constitution - Clause 25.2) & 22.4)i
1.2	Composition	
1.2.1	Convenor	
	The Convenor shall be elected by the General Committee of the Tamworth Hockey Association Incorporated in accordance with the constitution, and shall be responsible after the annual general meeting of the Association to convene a planning meeting for the following year.	Constitution - Clause 22.4).i
1.2.1.1	Annual Planning Meeting	
	The Planning Meeting must be convened within January or February each year and the date of the meeting shall be advertised for a period of not less than 14 days.	Constitution - Clause 22.4).ii & 22.4)iii
1.2.2	Delegates	
	One delegate per two teams or part thereof registered for the major competition with the Standing Committee (in the previous year) shall be entitled to attend the meeting, and shall have voting rights.	Constitution - Clause 22.5)
1.3	Quorum	
	A quorum shall be Seven (7) members who are entitled to vote.	
1.4	Changes to Policies	
	Policies may only be changed at the Planning Meeting or at a Special Meeting of the Standing Committee if agreed by 75 % of those present and entitled to vote.

	Nominations for Office Bearers will be advertised for a period of not less than 14 days prior to the Planning Meeting of the Standing Committee and should be submitted, in writing, to the Convenor.	
	In the event that no written nominations are received nominations from those present at the meeting shall be accepted.	
1.6	Meetings	
	Meetings of the Standing Committee shall be held each month between 1 February and 31 October each year. Additional meetings may be held as the Committee may decide.	
1.7	Special Meetings	
	A special meeting of the Standing Committee may be called at the discretion of the Convenor or on a requisition signed by 5 delegates to the Standing Committee.

2.1	Minimum number in teams	
	The Association shall not accept from any club the nomination of teams of less than 12 members.	By Laws 1.1

	Nominations for competitions shall close on the date stipulated by the Men's Standing Committee. Such nominations are to be delivered or posted to the Secretary.	By Laws 2.1

	The Standing Committee may accept or reject the nomination of any team.	By Laws 2.2
2.5	Single Team Clubs	
	The Standing Committee will accept single team Clubs in the Masters competition only.	Resolved 06/03/2000
3.0	COMPETITIONS	
3.1	Grading Lists	
	All players are required to have paid their Hockey NSW registration fee and their name to be listed within the Tamworth Hockey Association <i>RevolutioniseSport</i> member listing or with another Hockey Association prior to taking the field. If a player has not paid their Hockey NSW fee they will be considered nonfinancial and uninsured. Club Secretaries are to supply a grading list to the Secretary or Assistant Secretary prior to the fourth competition match.	Revised 04/09/2018
	Penalty: Failure for players to be registered with Hockey NSW prior to taking the field will result in a loss of competition points as per Clause 3.5.9 for the game in which the unregistered player took part.	Revised 04/09/2018
	Failure for Club Secretaries to provide a grading list by the agreed date will result in a loss of competition points as per Clause 3.5.9 for all teams within the Club from the fourth competition match until the grading lists are provided.	
3.1.1	Grading Lists	
	Players will be graded from highest to lowest, with the first 11 registered in First grade, the next 11 registered in second grade, and so on. A player will only appear in a Clubs grading list once and a designated goalkeeper shall be named for all grades.	
	Players whom the Club proposes to use as umpires shall also be indicated in accordance with Clause 6.0	
	No player shall appear in more than One (1) Club's grading list except in accordance with Clause 3.5.3.2.3	

3.1.1.1	Amendments	
	Any amendments to a Clubs Grading List, including the addition of new players, must be provided to the Secretary, or Assistant Secretary and approved if necessary, at least 3 days prior to the first competition game which relates to the amendment. Any new player must have paid their Hockey NSW registration fee and name be listed either within the Tamworth Hockey Association RevolutioniseSport member listing or with another registered Hockey Association prior to taking the field. Individual Clubs must complete their due diligence on any new player registration status before a player takes the field.	Revised 04/09/2018
	Penalty: If an amended grading list is not supplied or player registration with Hockey NSW is not confirmed prior to the player(s) in question moved or added to the grading list taking the field in accordance with this clause then the Club will be in breach until the necessary documents have been supplied and Clause 3.5.9 shall apply. 3.2	Dates and fixtures of all matches	
	The Standing Committee shall arrange dates and fixtures of all matches whatsoever arising during the competition.	
3.3	Clubs Failing to pay moneys	
	In the event of a club failing to pay monies owing by the date set by the Management Committee (i.e. either the Men's Committee or the Incorporated Body), the club shall be deemed forthwith to be unfinancial. The Treasurer shall give to such unfinancial club notice in writing by certified mail addressed to the Secretary of the club at his last registered address. Should outstanding monies not be paid to the Treasurer within seven (7) days of the posting of such notice the unfinancial club shall not score points in any games played by it until the outstanding monies are paid. 3.4	Age of players	
	The age of any player will be taken as at 1 st January of that year.	By Laws 3.0

3.5	Competition Matches	
3.5.1	Deferment of Matches	
	Matches shall be played on the day and at the time appointed. While deferment of matches is to be discouraged forfeits are equally undesirable and expectation is that they will be avoided. Preference is for a deferred match to be played within 2 weeks of the original scheduled date, however, in order to assist in ensuring that the match is able to be played and a forfeit avoided, then permission may be obtained from the Standing Committee to agree to an alternate time. Any request to defer a match submitted to the Standing Committee must include a commitment from both sides involved to play on a designated date and time. This time and date must be prior to the commencement of the finals. In the event the deferred match is approved no further deferment will be considered. Should the match not be played at the agreed date and time then the standard forfeit rules will apply.	Revised 04/09/2018
	If one team wishes to defer a match but the two sides involved cannot agree on a rescheduled date, and the match is not played as set down in the competition draw the team requesting the deferment will forfeit the match.	
	Penalty: If the event of a forfeit Clause 3.5.6 and 3.5.6.1 will apply.	Revised 04/09/2018
3.5.2	Deferment due to representative duties	
	A team with 3 or more players away representing Tamworth at State or National level may defer a match, subject to the agreement of the opposing teams Coach/Captain, and Clause 3.5.1.	
	Such agreement shall not be unreasonably withheld.	

3.5.3	Eligibility to play	
3.5.3.1	Games per round	
	If a player plays only one game during a weekend he is eligible to play for any grade. Where a player plays Two (2) games during a weekend no game may be played in a grade lower than the one in which he is graded with the exception of 3.5.3.2.	By Laws 4.2.1 Resolved 27/06/2011
	No player may play more than two games during a weekend. Deferred matches will relate to the weekend they were originally scheduled and the two match rule applies.	
	Players in 1^{st} grade should be discouraged from playing in a grade less than 2^{nd} grade (with the exception of Masters).	
	Penalty: If a player plays more than 2 games during a weekend then the player will be considered unregistered for the third and subsequent matches played and Clause 3.5.9 shall apply for the third and subsequent matches played by the player in that round. Matches will be counted in date and time order.	
3.5.3.2	Play in a lower grade	
	A player may play Two (2) matches in the same weekend with one being in a lower grade, only in the following circumstances;	Resolved 27/06/2011
3.5.3.2.1	Goalkeepers	
	A player registered as goalkeeper and playing a game as a goalkeeper, with the required protective equipment may also play as a field player in any grade.	Revised 11/02/2019
3.5.3.2.2	Field players	
	A player registered as a field player may also play as goalkeeper in any other grade, provided that he wears the required goalkeeper protective equipment and plays in the normal goalkeeping position.	

3.5.3.2.3	Masters	
	A player must be at least 35 years of age to be eligible to play in the Masters competition. If a player is younger than 35 but wishes to play Masters only, the Club may apply to the committee for permission for that person to play Masters only and not in any other grade.	Resolved 27/03/2011
	Players eligible to play Masters and playing for a Club which fields a Masters side may play for one other Club in any other grade.	Resolved 27/06/2011
	Players eligible to play Masters may be graded in any grade with Clauses 3.5.3.1, 3.5.3.2, 3.5.3.2.1, and 3.5.3.2.2 applying.	
	Penalty: Clause 3.5.9 shall apply in the event of any player playing in Masters in breach of this clause.	
3.5.4	Returning Representative Players	
	A current member of a Tamworth representative team living and playing in another Association's competition will be permitted to play in local competition matches during the same season provided that;	By Laws 4.2.3.1 Revised 04/09/2018
	He plays with the Club with which he was last registered when playing in the Tamworth competition.	
	The Club has included him on its current grading list.	
	He does not play in any of the Finals matches, subject to 4.2.4	
	The Club have confirmed that he has paid his Hockey NSW registration fee with another registered Hockey Association prior to taking the field. The onus is on the individual Clubs to complete their due diligence on new player registration status.	
	Penalty: If an amended grading list is not supplied or player registration with Hockey NSW is not confirmed prior to the player(s) in question taking the field in accordance with 3.1.1 then any match played by the representative players will be considered to be as unregistered until the necessary documents have been received and Clause 3.5.9 shall apply.	

3.5.5	Visiting Players	
	A visiting player who does not meet the eligibility rule in Clause 3.5.4 will be permitted to play in local competition matches if; The particular club has applied to and been granted permission, by the Standing Committee. Such permission to be granted prior to the first competition game played by the visiting player.	By Laws 4.2.3.3 Revised 04/09/2018
	An amended Grading List is to be provided in accordance with Clause 3.1.1. The Club have confirmed that he has paid his Hockey NSW registration fee with another registered Hockey Association prior to taking the field. 	Penalty: If an amended grading list is not supplied or player registration with Hockey NSW is not confirmed prior to the player(s) in question taking the field in accordance with 3.1.1.1 then any match played by the visiting players will be considered to be as unregistered until the necessary documents have been received and Clause 3.5.9 shall apply. 3.5.6	Forfeits	
	A team with less than (7) players will forfeit that game.	By Laws 4.3

	Penalty: In the event of a team forfeiting a game competition points will be awarded to the opposing team together with three (3) goals.	
3.5.6.1	Notification of forfeits	
	A team intending to forfeit a match shall give forty-eight (48) hours notice to their opponents and also to the secretary of the respective Standing Committee.	By Laws 7
	Penalty: Failure to comply with this rule will make a team liable for match expenses of both teams.	

3.5.7	Maximum number of players	
	A team may use a maximum of sixteen (16) players during any one game provided that no more than eleven (11) players are on the field at the one time. Replacement of players is to be under the control of the umpires or the ground manager subject to any conditions laid down by the Standing Committee.	By Laws 4.5
	Penalty: If a team plays more than 16 players that team will be considered to have played an unregistered player/s and Clause 3.5.9 shall apply.	
3.5.8	Two or more teams from the same Club in one grade	
	Two teams from the same club will only be accepted in the same grade if that Club has teams in all other grades.	Core players clause removed Feb 2016
	Where a Club has more than one team in any grade, six (6) players must only play for one team in the grade in each round. Players must not play in a team in a lower grade in accordance with 3.5.3.2 or more than two games in one round in accordance with 3.5.3.1	
	Penalty: In the event more than 6 players of one team play for the other side from the same Club, in the same grade, the player will be considered unregistered for team in which the second match is played and that team will be penalised in accordance with Clause 3.5.9.
